In modern mediation processes, information and communication technologies are of great importance. To enhance the role of mediation in resolving international and regional conflicts, it is necessary to address the above-mentioned problems through institutional and political reforms. To make mediation a more effective tool in international relations, it must be institutionalized at the global level. This includes the creation of specialized bodies under international organizations such as the United Nations that deal exclusively with mediation processes in political and social conflicts.

Increasing trust in mediators is a key step toward improving mediation effectiveness. For this purpose, mediators must be recognized and neutral



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individuals without personal or political interests in conflict resolution. This can be achieved by selecting mediators based on professional competence rather than political affiliation.

State institutions and civil society organizations should actively develop mediation competencies. This includes training opinion leaders, NGO representatives, and government officials in conflict resolution skills. In international relations, such an approach helps prevent escalation and enables early-stage conflict resolution.

One of the major political challenges of global and regional development is the unequal distribution of resources. Mediation can play an important role in resolving disputes related to access to resources such as water, oil, or land. A relevant example is the importance of resolving water resource distribution issues among Central Asian countries through mediation.

Ethnic and religious conflicts remain a significant challenge for global development.
